

150% Graduation Rates for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The School of Nursing monitors 150% graduation rates for each cohort in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). The School of Nursing has set its benchmark at the fall 2012 cohort and the target is to maintain a graduation rate of 90%. Note that the fall 2012 cohort for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing was the first cohort for the program and the degree is a 2 + 2 program which requires a completed ASN for admission to the program.

Exhibit 1 illustrates the Bachelor of Science in Nursing 150% graduation rates for each cohort. Graduation rates are defined as a cohort completing the program within 150% from the matriculation term.

The ACEN definition for 150% is calculated as a student graduating within six semesters within the matriculated term. The IPEDS definition for 150% is calculated as graduating within three years (or 9 semesters) from the matriculation term; this definition is adjusted because of the 2 + 2 program definition.




Exhibit 1: Bachelor of Science in Nursing 150% Graduation Rates
