

Transfer Students

At South Georgia State College, a transfer student is defined as having 30 or more transferable credit hours.

All persons seeking admission who have been previously enrolled in other institutions of higher education shall be admitted according to the following policies:

- Application for enrollment.
- One-time \$20.00 enrollment fee.
- Official high school transcripts with graduation date or official GED scores.
- Official College Transcripts (if applicable).
- An immunization record, completed by a health care professional.
- Lawful Presence.
- AccuPlacer and/or Compass Test scores.*

* AccuPlacer and/or COMPASS Test: The AccuPlacer Test and/or the COMPASS test can be exempted if the following requirements are met: SAT scores of 430 English, 400 math (Old SAT), Reading 24 and Math 22 (New SAT), or ACT scores of 17 English, 17 math. The AccuPlacer Test and/or the COMPASS test is used for entrance and placement purposes to determine whether learning support classes are needed.

The Compass Test is no longer being offered; however, we will continue to accept Compass Scores. The new placement exam is AccuPlacer.

College coursework: Students who transfer less than 30 hours of college or technical school coursework into SGSC will be classified as freshmen. In this case, SGSC requires all college or technical school transcripts to be mailed from the institution attended. Students transferring more than 30 hours of coursework will be classified as transfer students.
