Grade Point Average

- ASN applicants (LPN-RN Bridge Program and generic program): a minimum overall cumulative **GPA of 2.50** to apply.
- RN-BSN applicants: a required minimum overall cumulative **GPA of 2.50** is required to apply.

HESI A2 Exam (ASN and LPN-RN Bridge applicants only)

The SGSC version of the Elsevier HESI A2 Exam V I is required for ASN and LPN-RN Bridge applicants. It is a predictor of personal readiness and success in the nursing programs. **A minimum score of 75 is required on each section of the exam.** You will be tested on Vocabulary, Grammar, Math, Reading, Anatomy and Physiology. The Critical Thinking Section is also required. If you do not meet the minimum score requirements on each section, you may retake the entire HESI A2 V II during each year's application cycle. The application cycle for the HESI A2 Exam begins on October 1st and ends on the application deadline stated above. Applicant are only allowed 2 attempts to pass the HESI per application cycle. The highest scores from each category will be considered.

The first and last name on your Evolve account must be the same as it appears on your government issued photo ID with signature (i.e. Driver's License or Passport). The HESI A2 Exams are administered at a Prometric Testing Center in your geographic area https://www.prometric.com/elsevier. Applicants are encouraged to prepare for the examination by utilizing the HESI A2 Admission Assessment Exam Review, 4th Edition ISBN-13: 978-0323353786.

How do I register for my HESI A2 Distance Testing exam? Please follow the directions listed below on a computer and NOT from a smartphone.

- 1. You must have an Evolve student account with HESI Assessment. If you do not have an account, you can create it at: https://evolve.elsevier.com/
 - a. Go to https://evolve.elsevier.com/cs/ and click "I'm a student".
 - b. In the HESI Secured Exams section, click the link that says "Register for Distance Testing".
 - c. Click "Register" to place this in your cart, and then "Checkout/Redeem" from the cart screen.
 - d. If you are a returning user, enter your Evolve username and password and on the right side of the screen and click "Sign In". If you are new to Evolve, enter your name, email, desired password, and click "Continue".
 - e. Click "Checkout/Redeem," once again to finalize your selection.
- 2. Register for Distance Testing Exam
 - a. Click on "My Evolve."
 - b. Under HESI Assessment, select "Student Account" and agree to the Terms and Conditions.
 - c. Hover over the Distance Testing Tab and select "Register for a Distance Exam."
 - d. Complete the required information, check box, and click the "Submit" button.
- 3. Enter the appropriate school department's code: South Georgia State College-Distance Testing Department ID: 199898

Performance Standards for Admission to and Retention in the Associate of Science in Nursing and RN-BSN Degree Programs

A candidate for the Associate of Science in Nursing and RN-BSN degree programs must have abilities and skills of four varieties: Motor Skills, Sensory/Observation, Communication, Cognitive, Behavioral/Emotional, Professional Conduct. Reasonable accommodations may be made on an individual basis as directed by the Disabilities Coordinator; however, a candidate is expected to perform in an independent manner. Please read the performance standards for admission and progression in the nursing program.

Motor Skills: Candidates should have sufficient motor function so that they are able to execute movements required to provide general care and treatment to clients in all health care settings. (For example: For the safety and protection of the clients, the candidate must be able to administer intravenous, intramuscular, subcutaneous and oral medications; apply pressure to stop bleeding; open an obstructed airway; provide patient/client daily hygiene care; perform basic life support, including CPR, and function in an emergency situation. The candidate must have the ability to safely assist a client in moving, for example, from a chair to a bed, or from a wheelchair to a commode.)

Sensory/Observation: A candidate must be able to acquire the information presented through demonstrations and experiences in the basic and nursing sciences. He or she must be able to observe a client accurately, at a distance and close at hand, and observe and appreciate non-verbal communications when performing nursing assessment, planning, intervention, and evaluation. The candidate must be capable of perceiving the signs of disease and infection as manifested through physical examination. Such information is derived from images of the body surfaces, palpable changes in various organs and tissues, and auditory information (client voice, heart tones, bowel and lung sounds).

Communication: The candidate must communicate effectively and sensitively with other students, faculty, staff, clients, family, and other professionals. He or she must express his or her ideas and feelings clearly and demonstrate a willingness and ability to give and receive feedback. A candidate must be able to: convey or exchange information at a level allowing development of a health history; identify problems presented; explain alternative solutions; and provide education. The candidate must be able to communicate effectively in oral and written forms. The candidate must be able to process and communicate information on the client's status with accuracy in a timely manner to members of the health care team. The appropriate communication may also rely on the candidate's ability to make a correct judgment in seeking supervision and consultation in a timely manner.

Cognitive: A candidate must be able to measure, calculate, reason, analyze, integrate and synthesize in the context of undergraduate nursing study. The candidate must be able to quickly read and comprehend extensive written material. He or she must also be able to evaluate and apply information and engage in critical thinking in the classroom and clinical setting.

Behavioral/Emotional: A candidate must possess the emotional health required for the full utilization of his or her intellectual abilities, the exercise of good judgment, and the prompt completion of all responsibilities attendant to the diagnosis and care of clients and families. In addition, s/he must be able to maintain mature, sensitive, and effective relationships with clients, students, family, staff and other professionals under all circumstances including highly stressful situations. The candidate must have the emotional stability to function effectively under stress and to adapt to an environment that may change rapidly without warning and/or in unpredictable ways. The candidate must be able to experience empathy for the situations and circumstances of others and effectively communicate that empathy. The candidate must know that his or her values, attitudes, beliefs, emotions, and experiences affect his or her perceptions and relationships with others. The candidate must be able and willing to examine and

change his or her behavior when it interferes with productive individual or team relationships. The candidate must possess skills and experience necessary for effective and harmonious relationships in diverse academic and working environments.

Professional Conduct: Candidates must possess the ability to reason morally and practice nursing in an ethical manner. Candidates must be willing to learn and abide by professional standards of practice and South Georgia State College's School of Nursing policies. S/he must possess attributes that include compassion, empathy, altruism, integrity, honesty, responsibility and tolerance. Candidates must be able to engage in client care delivery in all settings and be able to deliver care to all client populations including but not limited to children, adolescents, adults, developmentally disabled persons, medically compromised clients, and vulnerable adults.

Background Check, Urine Drug Screening, Immunizations, and CPR Certification.

Clinical facilities utilized by South Georgia State College School of Nursing require a background check, a urine drug screen, immunizations, titers and CPR certification (American Heart Association or American Red Cross) prior to attending clinical. Based on the results of these screenings, the agencies may choose to disallow a student to attend clinical at their respective sites. To complete the nursing curriculum, students must be able to attend clinical. Failure to do so would result in the inability of the student to complete the program of study. Students must meet the facilities' requirements and deadlines as established by the SGSC School of Nursing.

Georgia Board of Nursing

In Georgia, applications for licensure received from individuals who have been charged with or convicted of a felony, a crime involving moral turpitude, a crime violating a federal law involving controlled substances or dangerous drugs, or a DUI or DWI will be reviewed by the Georgia Board of Nursing. The Board has the authority and responsibility to determine who will be licensed as a Registered Nurse in Georgia.
